**JUNE 2022**

This is an internship report done by KeneisaSothu, ShojilaKihomong, VeciseluLohe, Thejakhriezo Innocent, TawemuTrakha, Ruokuophre-o Keyho and SakuoKeyho of 3<sup>rd</sup> semester, B.Com, Don Bosco College, Kohima. The internship started on 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2022 and ended on 30<sup>th</sup> June 2022.

Arintin Venture is a Private Limited company located in Navodaya Vidyalaya Rd. There are 11 members in this company and Kikrusetuo John Pienyu is the MD and founder and currently managing all the activities of the company. It is a pig farm where we interned; currently they are rearing 75 pigs and is planning to increase the pigs from 75 to 200 by the end of this year. The company is also coming up with their own feed plant production which is probably going to set up and start running by next year.

During this internship, we have accumulated various experience and wider new knowledge through activities and task that had been assigned to us. We also acquired knowledge for our future career guidance. We were able to put our knowledge and skills into practice which have enhance the development of our working experience. We did so many hard labour activities like; cleaning the pig house, carrying firewood, clearing forest for the site of production of pig food, etc., Apart from the works we also enjoyed a lot communicating with them.

Working with Arintin Ventures during the one month of internship was quite interesting and we learned a lot. We express deep and sincere gratitude to our Principal and Teachers for giving us an opportunity to explore our professionalism.

The 12<sup>th</sup> June was the last day of special camp, the campers divided into two groups, went to Rüsoma Baptist Church and Rüsoma Christian Revival Church and together attended the Sunday Devotional program.

1. Library card with ID card is compulsory for getting the library.
2. All the users must observe total silence in the library.
3. All bags, cases, folders, etc. must be left at the property counter.
4. Entry in the entry register is mandatory.
5. Used of mobile phone is strictly prohibited.
6. The library staffs have the right to ask the students to leave the library if they are behaving in appropriately or causing disturbance to other users.
7. Show the books and other materials which being taken out of the library to the Library staff.
8. Books will be issued on presentation of the library card along with ID card.
9. Library borrower cards are not transferable. The borrower is responsible for the book borrowed on his/her card.
10. Students may borrow two books at a time for a period of 7 days and it can be renew two times.
11. Books borrowed should be returned on or before the due date, if returned late

- overdue fine Rs. 2 per day will be charged.
13. If book lost, the borrower shall replace the book of the same edition or latest edition with late fine.
  14. Marking, tampering, underlining, writing and tearing away the pages of the books are punishable with fine or replacement of the book or both.

He also taught how to search documents available in the library through OPAC. The programme was conducted for 15 minutes for each department. Temporary Students' library borrower cards were also issued in the programme then they can use it to access the library resources.

She is certified in Management Skills for Fresher in Career Guidance. ### **20<sup>th</sup> August 2022: Departmental Activity.**

#### **Department of Commerce.**

The Department Of Commerce on 20<sup>th</sup> August, 2022 conducted the first departmental activity on "Industrial Visit to JapfiiDzii Plant, Kigwema". The students and staff gathered together near PHQ junction and moved out at 9:00 am from the sumo stand. The department reached the JapfiiDzii plant around 9:45 am.

Mr. NeiletoThorie guided the students through the plant and explained about the working process and management of the company. The plant was established in the year 2005 and is a sole proprietorship business. Currently there are 10 employees working in the plant who are

given free lodging and fooding. He briefed the students about the water source which is directly taken from the Japfii River and generate about 2000 litres of water per hour and is purified through the various machines. The plant had the approval of the ISI, BIS, and FSSAI. At present they produced around 2000 bottles (20 litres per bottle) of water per day costing ₹40 per bottles and these bottles are reusable. There are four (4) vehicles used for supplying of the purified water in and around Kohima.

All together 17 students and 3 faculty visited the Plant. In this visit, the students were able to understand the working and production activity, management process; various technology used and also acquire knowledge and experience. The industrial visit was a success.

### **Department of Education.**

The department of Education, Don Bosco College, Kohima organised its first departmental activity on 20<sup>th</sup> August 2022 under the theme “Traversing Creativity”. The objective of the activity was to enhance creativity potentialities and at the same time create a sense of awareness on recycling waste materials through creativity. Through this platform the students were made conscious of how they can be a responsible contributor towards global warming.

During the activity, students undertook a creative recycling project wherein they recycled waste items to make pen stands, frames, paper bags, decorative items, paper baskets and the like. A total of 56 students from 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> semester activity took part in the program.

#### **Department Education Tour:**

##### **Education:**

After a gap of two pandemic affected years, Department of Education, Don Bosco College, Kohima under took its 4<sup>th</sup> Educational Tour from **6<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> December**. The educational tour was made by 5 students, guided and led by teaching faculty, Dr. Imtinaro Longkumer to Guwahati, Assam and Shillong, Meghalaya.

The group started the tour from 6<sup>th</sup> December 2022 by travelling to Dimapur from Kohima by regional taxi and by train from Dimapur to Guwahati, later in the evening. The group reached Guwahati around midnight and lodged at Don Bosco Institute(DBI), Kharguli, Guwahati.

December 7<sup>th</sup>: After breakfast at DBI the group visited to experience the longest river Rope Way of India, spanning atleast 2 KM, located at PanBazar, Guwahati main city. The ropeway journey gave a mesmerizing aerial view of the mighty Bhramaputra, Umananda Island and panoramic view of the city. On reaching the North terminal, the group took joyful scooty ride to view Dol Govinda Temple. After the breathtaking experience and lunch, the group went to the city's famous Dighlaipukhri park for a relaxing boat ride and later for a stroll at the city's busy fancy market. At night after dinner, the group had a brief prayer service before sleep.

December 8<sup>th</sup>: After breakfast at DBI, the group journeyed to Shillong, Meghalaya by taxi. The group reached Shillong late evening and accommodated at Pastoral Centre, Tripura Castle road, Shillong. The group had a brief fellowship time and prayer before resting for the night.

December 9<sup>th</sup>: The group started the day early to travel to Dawki, a border town in the south of Meghalaya. The place is famous for its crystal clear Umngot river, cleanest (in Asia) Mawlynnong village, evergreen surroundings and a gateway/border to Bangladesh. Another unique feature of the pristine river place is that the river flows partially into India and Bangladesh. The group enjoyed the day by experiencing a thrilling ride by car through the scenic valleys, majestic mountain ranges and an exciting boat ride in the Umngot-Dawki river. The day ended by scrumptious dinner at the Pastoral Centre and prayer fellowship at the room.

December 10<sup>th</sup>: On this day, the group after breakfast at the Pastoral centre went to visit Don Bosco Museum, Mawlai Shillong. The museum is acclaimed as one of the finest museum in Asia for the promotion of indigenous and tribal cultures. It provides a glimpse of the rich multi-culture, history, art and crafts, traditions etc of the indigenous people of North East India. The group later visited Oriens Theological College, where the students and teacher interacted with Father's and Brother's there over tea; later followed by visit to the college's Library and mini museum, guided by Fr. Paul Yanthan, the librarian. The day's tour ended by a brief visit to the famous Police Bazar, Shillong. After dinner at the Pastoral Centre, the group called off the night after regular prayer and worship time.

December 11<sup>th</sup>: It was one of the most hectic day for the touring group. The day was set aside for visits to several landmarks and tourist spots in and around Shillong. The first visit made was to the Indian Air Force Museum followed by visit to Wards Lake in the heart of the town. The group further visited the tourist spot - Elephant Falls and took a long ride to visit the Laitlum canyon, situated approximately 22 kilometres away from Shillong town. Later after dinner at the Pastoral Centre, the group called off the night after regular prayer and worship time.

December 12<sup>th</sup>: After breakfast the group journeyed back to Guwahati and stayed for the night.

December 13<sup>th</sup>: On the final day of the trip, the group journeyed via train to Dimapur and further proceeded towards Kohima by taxi.

It was brief and a successful and enriching experience.

### **English:**

According to Francis Bacon, travelling is a part of education. An excursion is not just a pleasure trip; it enhances the knowledge beyond the four walls of the classroom of the students. To provide such an enriching experience to students, the Department of English, Don Bosco College, Kohima undertook seven days educational tour to Gangtok, Sikkim and Darjeeling, West Bengal for six nights and seven days from 4<sup>th</sup> - 10<sup>th</sup> December, 2022. On Dec 4, 2022, twenty-four students from 5<sup>th</sup> semester under the guidance of Dr. Toshimenla Kichu started their journey from the college campus.

The group started their exhilarating journey by train and bus to reached Gangtok on Dec 5th and stayed at Yalung Retreat for two days and two nights during which the students visited the Gonjang Monastery located at an altitude of 6066 ft. which still continues the teaching and practices of their religion. Then proceeded to the **Tashi Viewpoint**, students were mesmerized by the surrounding view such as **Mt. Kangchenjunga, Mt. Siniolchu, Labrang Monastery and Phodong Monastery**. The last two destinations for the day were the **Plant Conservatory** (Flower Show) and **Hanuman Tak**. Wrapping the day was visitation to **Mahatma Gandhi Marg** for shopping and site tour. On 6<sup>th</sup> December 2022, the students savored the day by visiting the **Harbajan Singh Mandir, Alpine Adventure Park** and **Tsomgo Lake** in **Nathula Pass**, which is stand at a latitude of 12,313ft. known for its breathtaking

view especially in colder seasons where it is covered by snow and frozen lake and the yak ride. Next stop was **Alpine Adventure Park**, located at an altitude of 13,900 ft. Here, one can go for a boat ride and enjoy the time at one's own pace.

Last stop was **Baba Harbajan Singh Mandir**, located at an altitude of 13,123 ft. Mostly known for its legend, where the people still keep his place clean and ready for him, where automatically the place in the morning becomes messy and none can find him.

After two days and two nights in Sikkim, the next destination was Darjeeling (The Queen of Hills) the next day i.e., 7<sup>th</sup> Dec it was mostly travelling from Gangtok to Darjeeling. In the evening, the students explored **the Mall Road** and **Chauk Bazaar** and visited the local library and bookstores.

On 8<sup>th</sup> Dec 2022, the day got started at 4:00 am to observe the panoramic view of Mount Everest, Mount Kangchenjunga and the Sunrises from the Tiger Hill which lies at an altitude of 2590m. This experience was a magical moment for the students as they were awestruck by the enchanting sight of the sun rising from the horizon.

This was followed by visit to the Monastery and the Batasia Loop War Memorial, where it gives a view of the Darjeeling town with its rich past histories.

Next stop was the **Rock Garden, Japanese Temple** and **Tenjing Rock** climbing known for its beauty which attracts numerous amounts of tourists, where one can take time and enjoy the moment.

Last stop were the **Tea Garden** and **Rope way** where it serves both a recreational activity as well as to learn how tea leaves are harvested with tedious amount of hard work.

The day ended with the visitation to **St. Joseph's School North Point** one of the oldest schools in H, founded in the year 1888 and is owned and managed by the Jesuits.

On 9<sup>th</sup> Dec 2022, the last day of the tour the students visited two places: **Zoological Park** Darjeeling, an observation of the biodiversity within the zoo and **Himalayan Mountaineering Institute**.

The educational tour culminates by stepping their foot into Indo-Nepal border and reached Kohima by rail and road on 10<sup>th</sup> Dec 2022. This experience made the English Literature students visualize the broad spectrum of literary world. It also paved way to the repository of memories, wisdom and experiences that they will cherish as students of DBCK

### **History:**

Department of History, DBCK, took the 6<sup>th</sup> Semester students for an educational tour towards South India. The duration of the tour covered 14 nights and 15 days, from 4<sup>th</sup> December till 18<sup>th</sup> December, 2022. With the assistance from the *Help Line Travels and Tourism*, places like **Kochi, Allepy, Trivandapuram, Kanyakumari and Pondycherri** were visited. During the travelling, students also crossed Mumbai and Kolkata.

South India has rich and diverse cultural heritage. Their tradition display ancient cultural roots and the place have also witnessed many famous and flourishing dynasties. It is also a land where one can sense the influence of western cultures in certain areas. The purpose of this educational tour was to understand the cultures and history of South India. For this, 12 students and two teachers along with a tour guide participated in the activity.

Some places worthy to be mentioned are Church Boating Point, Lulu Mall, Chinese Fishing Net, Vasco-d-Gama Church in Kochi; Padmaswami Temple and Covalam Beach in Trivandapuram; Kanyakumari Temple, Vivekananda Memorial Rock and surrounding areas in Kanyakumari; Toured around Pondicherry city and studied about the French colonies; and lastly the Mahabalipuram temples. The group returned back to Dimapur, Nagaland on 18<sup>th</sup> December - evening. Some stayed back in Dimapur and others travelled back to Kohima the same night.

### **Political Science:**

Places like **Kochi, Allepy, Trivandapuram, Kanyakumari and Puducherry** were visited. The Visit to Indira Point the southernmost point of land in the Indian Territory was a very enriching experience for the students. The duration of the tour covered 14 nights and 15 days, from 4<sup>th</sup> December till 18<sup>th</sup> December, 2022 with the assistance from the Help Line Travels and Tourism. The group returned back to Dimapur, Nagaland on 18<sup>th</sup> December - evening.

### **Sociology:**

### **Department of Psychology**

On 18<sup>th</sup> March 2023, Department of Psychology organized capacity building under the topic “Mental Health First Aid” at 9:30 AM in the College Campus.

#### **Objectives of the department activity**

- Awareness of mental health
- Helps to break down the stigma around mental ill-health.
- Helping the students how to recognize the signs and symptoms of common mental health issues.
- Provides students with the basic skills and confidence to provide initial support to a person who is developing a mental health problem or experiencing a mental health crisis.
- Teaching the students to signpost others toward professional help.

The programme was chaired by Adane Pfolibo of 2nd Semester, followed by invocation led by Mereyani of 4th Semester. Welcome note was address by Idwabeule Liegise 2nd Semester, followed by a Special no. performed by the boys of 4th Semester.

The resource person, Miss Vetalü Nyekha presided over the programme, addressing the students on the topic "Mental Health First Aid". She gave much importance on how we should all be aware of the First Aid of Mental Health and how we can be helpful to those in need by offering initial support until professional help is received or until the crisis resolves. She talked about the goals of First Aid in Mental Health i.e to reduce the stigma, provide help to prevent the mental health problem from becoming more serious and to promote recovery of good mental health.

She also highlighted on how we need to be aware of the cues and indication in a person's mood or behaviour, to understand the signs and symptoms of an emerging or worsening mental health problem. These signs may include hallucinations, such as hearing or seeing things that aren't there, extreme mood changes, significant drop in performance at work or school, difficulty concentrating, significant withdrawal from friends and family, neglecting self-care (such as neglecting personal appearance and hygiene, and eating poorly), suicidal thoughts or behaviors along with destructive or high-risk behaviour.

Emphasizing about these problems, Miss Nyekha also stressed on what we can do on our part to provide first aid until the person has received appropriate professional treatment.

She said that one should approach the person in a comfortable space, make them see that we are concerned and help them see that we value their existence. We should respect the person's own interpretation of their symptoms and incase the person doesn't want to talk, we should encourage them to talk to someone else they trust. The speaker maintained that sometimes even with the best intentions, we can make matters worse. Thus when reaching out to someone one must avoid being hostile or sarcastic, trying to cure them or solve their problems all the time.

Then she concluded her speech by reminding the students that one should never blame or belittle and dismiss their feelings but instead emphasized on listening and avoiding giving any advices. We should hold their pain with them with simple questions and affirmations at the same time be aware that our job is to not fix them but that they just want to be heard. The programme concluded with Neingunuo4<sup>th</sup> Semester delivering the Vote of Thanks, followed by photo session and distribution of light refreshment.

### **Department of History:**

On the 18<sup>th</sup> of March, the department of history held an Invited Talk as part of their departmental activity. The invited speaker was Dr. Mepusangba, an independent researcher who spoke on the topic “What is a Museum?”
